Message from The Dean

Trying on!

To say that I do not possess an artistic or musical vein in my being is an understatement. Even though I am not strictly a left-brainer, it is safe to say that art in general is not my forte. I see myself as art appreciator and that is the extent of it. On the other hand, creativity and openness to the movement of the Spirit in today's church is probably the landmark of most clergy born in the 70s who were ordained and started to minister in the past two decades, during a time when the church's landscape is forever changing, fitting this category, I welcome and embrace creativity and change with passion.

It is in that ever-changing landscape that we, as a Cathedral in the 21 century are venturing to explore new practices that enhance our understanding of our calling to serve as a resource for the formation of apostles in the Episcopal Church in Connecticut. As we call it in ECCT "Try-Ons" give us an opportunity to open ourselves and our communities to new ways of embracing God's mission without committing firmly to a particular set of practices before learning from such experience.

We are more and more becoming intentional learning communities that exercise curiosity, teamwork and prayer in the work that we do.

A concrete example for us is the event our Cathedral will host at the New Britain Museum for American Art on June 23. This gathering seeks to host artists from across ECCT to engage in lively conversation, networking, sharing of best practices and fellowship. As a prelude for this event, representatives from the planning team will attend our ECCT Ministry Network Convocation on June 1, as we look to encourage the formation of a Visual Arts Ministry Network.

My hope is, without seeking a concrete outcome, that visual artists from across ECCT organize themselves to become a resource to the whole. Art is and has been for centuries a tool for community engagement. Can you imagine a Visual Arts Network that promotes and encourages parishes to use art as an

Can you picture an art exhibit season at The Commons or at our Cathedral open to all Episcopalians in CT once a year? The possibilities are limitless.

The process of organizing this event has been life-giving and eye-opening. The opportunity to share leadership with lay and ordained leaders from other parishes as we, Christ Church Cathedral, foster these type of initiative is a prelude of the collaborative nature of our work and our identity as the Cathedral of The Episcopal Church in Connecticut.

The planning group, in addition to Cathedral Artists and lay leaders, included Clergy and members from St. Mark's New Britain, St. Mary's Manchester and Trinity, Hartford. And the "try-ons" continue! I have extended an invitation to my clergy colleagues from the Greater Hartford Area to join us for our Annual Jazz Mass on July 17. The Rev. Don Hamer will preach, and the Rev. Susan Pinkerton of St. John's, West Hartford, the Rev. Tracy Russell Johnson of St. Monica's, Hartford and I will con-celebrate. Our Chapter is exploring "try-ons" in the four areas we have identified and communicated to you in previous issues and forums. As you participate in these conversations and "try-ons", please share your insight and learnings as we continue to grow together.

Our Dean Has Been Named a Chaplain to the House of Bishops!

Congratulations to our Dean Miguelina!

The Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church, the Most Rev. Michael Curry, has named her as one of the two new chaplains who will serve the House of Bishops. The House of Bishops is made up of all bishops of the Episcopal Church, active or retired. It has nearly 300 active members and comprises half of the governing body of the Episcopal Church. It meets every three years for General Convention and twice a year between conventions in a non-legislative capacity. The chaplains are responsible for coordinating worship for the HoB. Chaplains are also available to provide pastoral care to bishops, who like any other member of the church, have spiritual needs in their own lives. It is also the role of the chaplains to assist the Presiding Bishop in nurturing a prayerful atmosphere during the meetings of the House of Bishops. Our Cathedral congregations know from experience that the choice of our Dean to extend her pastoral skills in a new direction was a wise one.
