Around God's Table: A Liturgical Festival
May 6-7, 2017

On May 6 and 7, a collaboration of Christ Church Cathedral and Camp Washington will bring together lay youth and adult leaders from throughout the Episcopal Church in Connecticut [ECCT]. Included will be acolytes, vergers, ushers, greeters, Altar Guilds, choirs and more, gather for mutual learning, sharing of best practices, listening to each other's stories and celebrating their ministries.

Around God's Table: A Liturgical Festival will take place at Camp Washington in Lakeside, Connecticut, the official Camp and Conference Center of ECCT. Attendees will be able to explore such varied subjects as worship planning, music, and the use of incense. The youth will stay at the camp on Saturday evening.

On Sunday, May 7, both youth and adults will gather at our Cathedral for a closing Eucharist. There will be a sharing and celebration of the diversity of gifts and roles that support our common worship. Both Bishops Ian Douglas and Laura Ahrens will join on both days.

Looking Ahead to Pentecost and International Day on June 4

Pentecost is a Christian holy day commemorating the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles as they were praying together. Pentecost—which in Greek means the 50th day—takes place 50 days after Easter and marks the birth of the Christian church as described in the Book of Acts. The apostles on that day received “the gift of tongues”—the ability to understand each other in other languages as they spoke about God's marvelous works.

At the Cathedral on Sunday, June 4, Pentecost will be celebrated together with International Day at a single bilingual service at 10:30 a.m. At the Fellowship Hour food representing diverse cultures will be enjoyed.

A main sign of Pentecost is the color red, symbolizing the joy and fire of the Holy Spirit. Plan now to be part of a wonderful celebration – and wear something red!

A Good Friday Journey: Four Churches Mark the Stations of the Cross in Downtown Hartford



On Good Friday, April 14, an old tradition was rekindled with the joining of four Hartford churches to observe the Stations of the Cross on Main Street, Hartford. For Christ Church Cathedral, Central Baptist Church, Center Church and St. Monica's Episcopal Church, it was a public witness of faith in the heart of the city.

Hymns were sung, each of the 14 Stations was identified, a reflection was spoken, and moments of silence were held by participants. The journey began at Central Baptist Church near the south end of Main Street and concluded at the Cathedral where the Seven Last Words of Jesus were the focus of the closing devotions. Worshippers unable to make the street journey were waiting inside the Cathedral.

The worship participants were the Rt. Rev. Ian Douglas, Bishop Diocesan of the Episcopal Church in Connecticut; the Very Rev. Miguelina Howell, Dean, Christ Church Cathedral; the Rev. Damaris Whittaker, Center Church; the Rev. Tracy Johnson Russell, St. Monica's Episcopal Church; the Rev. John Endler, Central Baptist Church; the Rev. Canon Tim Hodapp, Christ Church Cathedral; the Rev. Molly James, Christ Church Cathedral.

Ordination and Consecration of the XI Bishop of the Diocese of Indianapolis



Dean Howell represented our Bishops and ECCT at the Ordination and Consecration of the Rev. Jennifer Baskerville- Boroughs as XI Bishop of the Diocese of Indianapolis. Bishop Baskerville- Boroughs is the first African American female to become diocesan bishop and her ordination marked the first time in the history of the church that a woman succeeds another woman in a diocesan position.

Bishop Baskerville-Boroughs and Dean Howell are CREDO colleagues and served together as members of the Council of Advice for the President of the House of Deputies of the Episcopal Church.
